

The Veteran Professional Networking & Resource Fair aims to prepare CUNY Veterans, Reservists, Service Members & Military Dependents for post-graduation success by providing information on employment/internship opportunities and graduate/professional school. Student attendees are introduced to community partners that offer FREE resources to veterans, which include resume writing assistance, legal aid, housing, mentorship and many others. Over 3,000 CUNY Veterans from our 24 campuses are invited, including graduate and undergraduate students.

- Employment opportunities for those who are graduating between the Fall 2017 and Spring 2018.




















CUNY Leading the Way
